(7/5-7/8)

Learn the science behind which cars win our ramp races and play a fast-paced game of Lego Pictionary. Each camper will take home their favorite new creations at the end of the week.

5. Animal Antics

(7/11-7/15)

Bring your binoculars, safari hat and notebook for a week of animal exploration. Learn about endangered animals from the rainforests and around the world. Participate in a dinosaur bone dig, make collages of your favorite animal habitats and become trackers as we learn how to identify various animal footprints. You never know what you might find!

6. Imagination Station

(7/18-7/22)

Hear Ye! Hear Ye! His Royal Highness, the King of Carden Court, requests the presence of all brave knights and fair maidens for a week of legends and mythical magic. Learn to juggle like the court jesters, perform magic tricks like the great Merlin and discover the facts or fiction behind unicorns and fire-breathing dragons!

7. Incredible Insects

(7/25-7/29)

Discover a world of secret survival skills from camouflage to super strength as we delve into the incredible world of insects. Watch the metamorphosis of mealworms and collect, identify and build habitats for creepy crawlies, as we learn about bugs, from the beautiful to the bizarre.

8. Pirates and Adventurers

(8/1-8/5)

Ahoy There Matey! The Jolly Roger will be flying high as our pirate campers set sail for a week of swashbuckling adventure upon the seven seas. (8/15-8/19)

Spend the week discovering ways to help our environment and make it more beautiful at the same time! Campers will learn the parts of a plant and grow seeds in some unlikely places. Be ready to create healthy and fun organic snacks to munch on as we dig up an appetite for a greener world!

11. Junior Olympics

(8/22-8/26)

On your Mark, Get set, Go! Campers will become athletic superstars this week as we participate in activities from the three-legged race to the hurdles. We will make our own Olympic torches, discover the difference between water and sports drinks and end the week with a Field Day, complete with medals!
